"Paul's Love, Our Love, For God's Church"

Week 1: History Leading Up to the Letter

The Corinthian Church was founded by Paul on his **second** missionary journey, where he spent **18** months teaching and preaching.

Paul wrote his <u>first</u> letter, now <u>lost</u>, followed by 1st Corinthians, his <u>second</u> letter, which addressed two problems in the Church:

- 1) <u>Interpersonal</u> relationships between believers in the Church.
- 2) How **corporate worship** time was being **conducted**.

Paul called for <u>unity</u> through the <u>recognition</u> of <u>roles</u> in Christ's body, and through <u>love</u>, and of the <u>centrality</u> of the <u>resurrection</u> in our faith.

Paul <u>returned</u> to Corinth where he was <u>publicly</u> attacked, and was <u>hurt</u> when the Church did not stand up for him.

Paul writes a **third** letter, also **lost**, referred to as a **sorrowful** letter (2 Corinthians 2:4 & 7:8).

The Corinthian Church seems to have <u>accepted</u> the letter and <u>repented</u>. 2nd Corinthians is then the <u>fourth</u> letter and is a <u>response</u> to their repentance.

Scripture Focus: 2 Corinthians 1:1-2

The two opening **greetings** of 1st and 2nd Corinthians are almost **identical**, except the former calls for **unity**, while the latter **extends** out to the greater area.

The overall focus of the book is divided into three parts: **Comfort** for the Church, Paul's **heart** for the Church, and the need to stand against **heretical** teachers.

God is calling <u>us</u> to <u>love</u> his <u>Church</u> as he does, and how **Paul shows** us in this letter.

Scripture Reference: **Ephesians** 5:25b

Challenge:

Look at your past experiences in the Church, good and bad, and realize the pain that resided in it. Then prepare your heart to love the Church as Jesus does.
