
A Note From the Youth

Looking Towards the Future

When I've asked what would be something that we could physically improve at the church facilities to make it better, there was always three things: More space for kids, more fellowship space, and more bathroom space. We have accomplished the kid space, we working on the fellowship space, by expanding our foyer area, but due to a water break under our concrete slab, our attention changed to renovating the restrooms.

We began this renovating last winter by contacting a local contractor to do the renovation because there was going to be a lot of saw cutting. When the contractor informed us that ADA was changed, we realized that our initial remodel idea was not going to work.

So we expanded it to pop out the back wall of the main building and adding four new stalls for both restrooms.

This brought up an issue with the town and what should have began in April, took until July 25th to resolve. But now we are on track, except, instead of being a focus of the contractor over the summer, we are



now having to work within his schedule. If you return before November, you'll be subject to one bathroom for everyone, located in the office area. If you come after November, you'll have a brand new space to enjoy.
